

Protecting Precious Cargo

Traveling with children can be difficult at times, and no, we are not talking about the endless questions from the back seat or the constant reminders that someone's arm has crossed that imaginary line in the middle of the back seat. We are talking about trying to figure out the unique laws that apply when traveling with children. The Nebraska Office of Highway Safety provides an easy to understand summary of Nebraska child restraint laws on their website as follows:

- All children up to age six must ride correctly secured in a federallyapproved child safety seat.
- Children ages six up to age eighteen must ride secured in a safety belt or child safety seat.
- Children up to age eighteen are prohibited from riding in cargo areas.
- Childcare providers must transport all children securely in an appropriate safety seat or safety belt.
- Drivers and front seat passengers are required to ride buckled up in a safety belt or child safety seat.

As a parent or someone who transports children, it is also important to recognize that state child restraint laws may not necessarily match the recommendations set by safety experts. With the passing of laws, there is a balancing act to determine what can realistically be put in place and enforced. This can sometimes "water down" a more stringent safety recommendation. Ingredients:

- Two 12-oz bags frozen mixed berries
- 1 box white cake mix (no pudding)
- 1 can of diet 7-up, Sprite, or Sierra Mist (clear soda)

Instructions:

Place frozen fruit in a 9x13 baking dish. Add dry cake mix evenly over the top of the fruit. Pour the soda slowly over cake mix. DO NOT stir the cake mix and the soda - this will give you a 'crust'. If you stir the two, you will have a cake like topping.

Bake at 350° for 45-50 minutes.
